



The Accessibility Guide of The Cotswold Tour Guide

The Cotswold Tour Guide provides guided tours around the Cotswolds and beyond in his BMW X5.

This vehicle is ideal for wheelchair users, as its large boot can accommodate the wheelchair, whilst you sit high up for a good view of the passing countryside.



Moreover, if you carry a Blue Badge Disabled Parking Permit then David can park close to the next stop on your itinerary. This will also assist with parking close to toilet facilities, particularly if you have a disabled radar toilet key.

David welcomes assistance dogs, which can travel in the car with you.

David will collect you from/take you to wherever you wish within his charge for the day; so you haven't got to worry about getting to/from the tour.

Also, when you pay for your tour it is one price whether there be one or four of you in the car; so your personal care assistant (should you have one) will be included in your fee.

If you have impaired hearing or eye sight then the BMW's two i-Pads can help orientate you during your tour via their Accessibility mode.

David's tours are always bespoke to your specific requirements; so when you are planning your day out he can research the accessibility of each location and thereby ensure you have a seamless experience on the day.
